- 1 person to be stationed at the door directing where the take-in of the quilts will be).

REMINDER for the take-in of your quilts/items:

- Each quilt must be in a separate see thru plastic bag.
- The "Pin to Quilt Receipt" must be SAFETY PINNED (Please - No straight pins) to the lower back side of the quilt/item and visible thru the bag.
- A hanging sleeve on the quilt/item, if required.

What is the Consignment Table

For any of our new members, here is the lowdown on the consignment shop I'm in charge of at the quilt show. It's a wonderful place where you can sell all your unwanted patterns, magazines, books, fabrics, templates or other quilting/sewing items AND finished quilts or sewn items like tote bags, place mats, wall hangings and table runners. All you have to do is see me to get a letter of the alphabet and a seller's card. Then you start piling up what you want to sell, put your "letter" and a price on each item, list it on your seller's card and bring it all to me on Friday night, Oct. 9. My team and I will take care of the rest. We display everything on tables and quilt racks. We record each sale and after the show, Donna figures it all out. You get 90% of your total sale and the guild keeps 10% to put in the bank toward the next quilt show. Where could you sell your things for only a 10% commission fee? See me at the June meeting or in September for a letter and seller's card, or to sign up to work at the consignment shop. I have 2 time slots left; one on Saturday afternoon, one on Sunday afternoon.

President's Request

Usually at our May meeting, I ask for volunteers for committee work for the upcoming guild year. But we needed to speak to you about the workers needed for the October quilt show, and I didn't want to confuse people. Here are the details on what openings we have for the 2009-2010 year.

Welcome Committee ~ perfect for someone who likes to make sure all their guests are comfortable and have someone to talk to. Looks for new members to make sure they have a table to sit at and answers any questions about what we do. One year the Welcome Committee prepared bags with donated FQs and sewing items for special drawings for that year's new members.

Sunshine Committee ~ the job for someone who likes to send cards in the mail (the guild will pay for the cards and postage) when condolences or congratulations are appropriate. Ideally, this person should have an email address that they check regularly, as this is the best way for us to notify you that a card should be sent.

Refreshments ~ ideal for someone who won't mind picking up some refreshments and setting them out for our mid-meeting break.

Challenge ~ for the creative person who thinks outside the box and wants to challenge the membership to make something they wouldn't ordinarily choose to do.

Community Outreach ~ needs a generous soul who can store a roll of batting, and bring some when a member needs batting

for a charity quilt. Collects finished quilts at our monthly meeting (blankets, dog beds, heart pillows and whatever else we think up) and delivers them to various community services for disbursement to those in need. Some of these committees need several workers; others can be done by one person. Can you be that person for a year? This is how I really got involved in the guild after sitting on the sidelines my first year. Yes, it does mean a commitment of time, like standing behind the refreshment table for 15 minutes. Or addressing a card at home. Or being in charge of one meeting during the year to present the challenge entries. Or dropping off items in town so animals and people who are having a hard time will know that we care about them.

See me or call me if you are interested or have questions about any of the committees we need to fill. If you'd like to help, but not be the committee head, that's fine.

You don't have to do exactly what the person before you did; programs have been changed and improved every time a new person takes over.

Or if you'd like to help on some other committee, like Block of the Month, Newsletter or Christmas Outreach, let me know and I'll pass your name along to the appropriate committee head.

By the way, the quilt show committee heads want to thank you for your overwhelming

response at the May meeting to their request for workers. Some committees still need workers but we slept a lot better that night after so many of you signed up to work at the show. Together we can have a successful show in October AND an efficiently run guild for next year. Thanks to all of you,

Quilt Show Registration Guidelines

1. A registration form must be completed for each entry along with a color photo. The 3-attached receipt forms must be completed with **PRINTED LAST NAME** (on each "Pin to Quilt form", "Owner receipt" and "Guild receipt"). Include the quilt name. **Registration forms must be submitted by July 14, 2009. Return both pages of the Registration forms, filled out completely.**
2. To exhibit, you must be a **member of CVQG-NY by April 4, 2009.**
3. **HANGING SLEEVES** required: Either machine baste or hand baste the sleeve to the top of quilt back. A 12" piece of muslin, folded in half is suggested so that it will allow a 2x4 to go through it for the hanging rack.
4. **TAKE IN DAY** is Thursday, October 8, 2009 from 4 pm to 7 pm at Bailey Avenue School in Plattsburgh, NY. Each item must be in a separate see through plastic bag. The Pin to Quilt receipt must be pinned to the lower back side of the item and visible through the bag. You will receive the Owner Receipt, which you must present at pick up time to get your quilt back after the show.
5. Select only one **Category** for your entry from the following:
 - LARGE QUILT** - a perimeter of 225 inches or more
 - MEDIUM QUILT** - a perimeter of 121-224 inches
 - SMALL QUILT** - a perimeter of 120 inches or less
 - CHALLENGE QUILT**
 - 2008 -Brown Bag
 - 2009 - yet to be determined
 - WEARABLE/OTHER** - Be sure to describe it
6. **"FOR SALE"** items are NOT released until the Take-Down and then only to the owner of the item.
7. **TAKE-DOWN** is Sunday, October 11, 2009, between 5 pm and 6 pm. You must pick up your item(s) then, or if you arrange for someone else, that person must have your Owner Receipts. No receipt, No quilt.

Show premises are locked during non-operating hours.
